

Turtle Creek Park in East Buffalo Township is 79 acres of woodlands, hills, fields, streams, and wetlands. It is one of the last large parcels of open land in the township. Bordering Furnace Road, it stretches from Supplee Mill Road to just west of Route 15.

For years, the site was officially Turtle Creek Park. But for most visitors, with or without pups, it was simply "the dog park," a diverse wildlife habitat loved for its openness and wild character. The Turtle Creek Park Association caringly tended the property.

Those who saw the land as their space—a place for humans and dogs

alike to experience nature and interact with others—were stunned in 2018 by the announcement that the property's owner—Hallowing Run Youth Organization—was planning to sell the park to the Lewisburg Alliance Church. Following the sale, the park's fenced-in dog plot was removed and 35 acres of trees were clear-cut. This was in anticipation of development that would include a church complex, gymnasium, and soccer fields. Visitors, however, were still welcome to walk the trails and bring dogs on leash.

But by 2022, the Lewisburg Alliance Church's vision had changed. Two

years of COVID-19, 4 years of mortgage payments, and the extent of the property's wetland areas had shifted perspectives on building project. With a new pastor on board, church leaders approached the East Buffalo Twp. Supervisors—Jim Knight, Katie Evans, and former Turtle Creek Park Association board member Char Gray—who were determined to acquire and protect the land as an East Buffalo Twp. public park.

Since then the supervisors have purchased and taken possession of the 79 acres at a price of \$950,000. EBT received a \$300,000 gift from the

fom page 1.) Degenstein Foundation and a \$685,000 grant from the state Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, coming mostly from American Rescue Plan Act money appropriated for recreation and conservation.

Merrill Linn Conservancy and EBT Craft Conservation

Easement The Conservancy, over its 35-year-history, has worked primarily with individual landowners who want to preserve their land as it is forever. They want to know that the next owner—whether a family member or a stranger—will be legally bound by the conservation easement that they and the Conservancy designed.

The model conservation easement required for public lands and parks is briefer and easier to write than easements protecting private property. But clearly thought-out and precisely-written easements are essential for maintaining the vision for public property.

As the Turtle Creek Park easement document was written, as many as six to seven Conservancy Site/Stewardship committee members were at the table, while as many as three East Buffalo Twp. Supervi sors were present. That was an advantage in drawing out a wide variety of ideas and opinions during the easement writing process. But it also guarantees turnover of leadership. At our latest meeting, one of the EBT Supervisors observed, "In 10 years it is likely that none of us will be sitting at this table." So, a clear vision for the property's future, spelled out in a conservation easement, is essential.

The Turtle Creek Park easement has been reviewed by counsel for both East Buffalo Township and for the Merrill Linn Conservancy. A final document should be completed and signed in a few weeks. In future issues, we will look at how the complete conservation easement is being realized at the park.

IN MEMORIAM

John Snook, a past president and longtime Board member of the Linn Conservancy, passed away in late December following a lengthy battle with Glioblastoma.

As a farmer of 37 years with a family tradition of sustainable farming practices, he brought a valuable perspective on agricultural conservation issues to the Conservancy. The land that he farmed was formerly known as the Seebold farm. The Seebolds were among the first families in Union County to treat farm-

land in accordance with The Nature Conservancy's "best practices."

A 1986 Penn State University graduate with an AG/Business Management Degree, John was a past board member of the Farm Service Agency and Mifflinburg Young Farmers. He was also a member of the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau and the Mifflinburg Kiwanis Club.

John is survived by his wife of 32 years, Kim Bowersox Snook, and his mother, Nancy Seebold Snook, among others.

Adventure Coordinator Becky Cunfer Launches Spring Nature Programs

The Linn Conservancy is launching an exciting, expanded program of nature events for children, teens, adults, and multi-generational families beginning in March. It is all happening thanks to a grant and a substantial donation from a longtime Conservancy member.

Our **Adventure Coordinator Becky Cunfer** came on board last fall as a part-time employee whose position was funded by a portion of an education-outreach grant from the 1994 Charles B.
Degenstein Foundation. Working limited hours, Becky developed and presented five well-attended programs, including an owl prowl that attracted 53 to Dale's Ridge.

She increased social media engagement with 2 to 3 posts per week to Facebook and Instagram and postings to Kids Critter Challenge (activities for families). Becky increased awareness of the Merrill Linn Conservancy through participation at local fall events where her hands-on nature activities attracted children and adults.

At one of these fall events, retired Bucknell professor William Becker met and talked with Becky about her goals for Linn Conservancy's outreach, especially for children. He was impressed by her wide experience, her ideas for Conservancy outreach events, and enthusiasm for bringing nature and environmental issues to young people through exciting, hands-on programs.

Becker believes the Conservancy will benefit from expanding Adventure Coordinator position to fulltime status. Working with Operations Manager Chad North and Treasurer Cheryl Stayton, Becker made a substantial donation to create a fund that will accomplish that goal for the next two years.

Becky, who will begin working fulltime in March following a family vacation in Alaska, says, "The Linn Conservancy is now offering open enrollment for a funfilled lineup of nature programs for all ages and interests."

Enrollment opportunities include:

- Nature's Explorer programs for children ages four to ten years old. These programs are hosted at the Dale Engle Walker Homestead and Dale's Ridge Trail in conjunction with the Lewisburg Children's Museum, Bucknell University and the Union County Historical Society.
- Junior Naturalist programs will be available for children ten to seventeen years old.
