

GUIDELINES FOR ARTISTS

PLEIN AIR DAY April 29, 2018

- Everyone from budding to accomplished artist is welcome to participate.
- A parent or guardian must supervise students under the age of 16.
- No pets.
- Artwork may be done in any medium you wish.
- Create artwork by yourself or in a group.
- Stay in one place, stroll from spot to spot, work at one site or visit each.
- Please visit only designated areas.
- Please bring all your own equipment as well as lunch, snacks and water. These will not be available at the locations.
- Please defer to the property owners when creating art on Linn Conservancy properties that are privately owned. These sites are some peoples' homes.

“Take nothing; leave nothing but footprints.”

- Please do not remove or disturb anything native to the sites (vegetation, animals, rocks). Let's leave it as we found it.
- Please leave absolutely no trash or waste at the sites—including water or solvents used to clean brushes. Bring a container for waste liquid and take it home. Trash bags in which you may place your waste are included in your Event Packet.

While the Plein Air Event is free and open to all artists in our region, **SPACE FOR THE PLEIN AIR WORKSHOP IS LIMITED. REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED.** Email workshops@lewisburgartscouncil.com to register for the workshop. There is no registration fee.
